To Whom It May Concern:

Over the course of the semester some important Jewish holidays fall on scheduled class days. On these days, Jewish students are often required to fulfill religious obligations at times that classes are being held or are unable to take examinations.

The University of Miami Academic Bulletin for 2019-2019 states that

"Any student absent from class in observance of a religious holy day shall not be penalized in any way for an examination or assignment missed during the period of absence. Absence in observance of a religious holy day does not relieve students from responsibility for any part of the course work required during the period of absence. Students who are absent on days of examinations or class assignments shall be offered a reasonable opportunity to make up the work without penalty, if the student previously arranged to be absent..."

In the Fall 2018 semester, the holidays that may coincide with classes are:

Rosh Hashanah Eve September 9 Rosh Hashanah, 1st day September 10 Rosh Hashanah, 2nd day September 11 Yom Kippur Eve September 18 Yom Kippur September 19 Sukkot Eve September 23 Sukkot, day 1 September 24 Sukkot, day 2 September 25 Shmini Atzeret Eve September 30 Shmini Atzeret October 1 Simchat Torah October 2

(Note: Jewish holy days begin at sundown the previous evening. A student who can't travel after sundown may need to leave before in order to make it home before the sun sets.)

Students who miss classes because of these holidays, must be given an equivalent make-up opportunity.
